Footnotes and Biographies

Most of the information herein was derived from family histories and individual recollection. There has been some original research using the Internet. Since most of the historic material predates modern technology, such as photocopiers and scanners, there were virtually no original documents available to me. All source documents have been copies; the oldest being copied in longhand and later, typewritten facsimiles. These were available for this compilation only as a photocopy of that copy, and often the photocopy was not the first generation. Consequently, there may be numerous factual and clerical errors, particularly in the spelling of proper names, due to illegible copies, typographical errors in transcription, and where the recollection was originally oral and not written.

Most of the family history prior and contemporary to my grandfather, Emory Asbury Martin, came from a "History of the Martin Family of Northampton County, North Carolina" written by Mary Cranston, whose grandfather and my great uncle, was Robert McKinney Martin, Sr. This work came to me almost thirty years ago from Sammy Ennis, whose grandfather, John Bunyan Martin was my uncle. It has been an invaluable resource. My greatest regret is that I waited too long to compile this material. Many who were knowledgeable and could have contributed are now gone.

¹Family tradition has it that two Martin brothers, John and Etheldred, came to North Carolina sometime during the first half of the 18th century, most likely from Virginia. They settled in the area which later became Northampton County. Historically, most North Carolinians came from the Virginia Colony and were, for the most part, Protestant immigrants or their descendents from the British

Isles. Northampton became a county in 1741. As early as 1742, there is a deed recorded in the Northampton County Courthouse in Jackson attesting to the sale of 50 acres, more or less, on Kirby's Creek on the south side of the Meherrin River from George Buntin to John Martin for four pounds. Other deeds record the purchase from John Ganey of about 200 acres near Paddy's Delight Creek in 1744 for eight pounds by John Martin and its subsequent sale by John and Lucy Martin in 1753 to Phillip Jones for twenty pounds. Subsequently, deeds show that John Martin bought about 150 acres also on Paddy's Delight Creek in 1755 from Benjamin Deberry for thirteen pounds. And in August of 1762, there was a land grant in consideration of ten shillings Sterling of 675 acres on Paddy's Delight Creek to John Martin from the Right Honorable John Earl Grandville, Viscount Carteret and Baron Carteret of Hawnes, Lord Proprietor of Carolina, of land by Charter from his most Excellent Majesty, King George II, of Great Britain.

⁴When planning to marry during this period, the prospective groom took out a bond from the clerk of the court in the bride's county of residence as surety that there was no legal obstacle to the proposed marriage. Such a bond was issued for the marriage of Kinchen Martin, Jr. to Latitia Garris on January 26, 1830. The marriage bond for his second marriage to Sally Garris was issued on April 7, 1830, less than three months later! There is no information as to what happened but my presumption is that Latitia died shortly after the marriage and that Sally Garris was perhaps related to Latitia and already known to Kinchen because this was an awfully short courtship.

⁵The marriage bond for Kinchen to marry Harriet Garris was issued on March 1, 1841. We know from a story related to Mary Cranston by her grandfather, Robert McKinney Martin, that in this case, Harriet Garris was indeed related to Sally Garris, whom Kinchen had married just eleven years earlier. In fact, his third wife was his step-daughter. Harriet Garris was the daughter of Sally Garris from a prior marriage.

⁶Never married.

²No marriage records exist for Northampton County for this period, most probably 1790 to 1800.

³Margaret Martin, wife of John Martin, Jr., may have been Peggy Norsworthy.

⁷Both Sidney (also seen as "Simeon") Peter Martin and James Edgar Martin enlisted on May 23, 1861 in the Confederate Army at Garysburg, N.C. as a Privates in Company A, 5th Regiment of the North Carolina Infantry, later renamed as the 15th Regiment. James Edgar Martin was captured April 3, 1865 at Petersburg, Virginia. He was repatriated by Oath of Allegiance to the United States and released at Point Lookout, Maryland, on June 29, 1865.

⁸Jesse Winefrey Martin was a graduate of Randolph Macon College and a Methodist minister. He officiated at the marriage of his nephew, William Christian Martin to Louisanna (Luzi Ann) Moss. Subsequently, William Christian Martin, who also was a Methodist minister, assisted in the marriage of his niece, Harriet Corinna Martin to Stephen Hebert.

⁹These three children of Robert McKinney and Sadie Catherine Parker Martin died in infancy.

¹⁰Jesse O. Draper was my first grade teacher at Fred A. Olds Elementary School in Raleigh, N.C., 1950-1951.

¹¹Diantha Thomas Carter was my seventh grade teacher at Josephus Daniels Junior High School in Raleigh, N.C., 1956-1957.
